PERSONS *of the* YEAR

Actress Sheryl Lee Ralph and Olympian Kirani James

At the Billie Holiday Theatre, Sheryl Lee Ralph became emotional when teenager Amaryliss Greene, Trinidadian-American and resident of Long Island, asked Sheryl Lee to autograph the first flyer Sheryl Lee graced in high school. The establishment failed to include teenager Sheryl Lee's photograph in the flyer although she was in the play, the only Black girl. Therefore, Sheryl Lee created her own flyer to include her photo. And, it is a copy of that flyer Greene, sitting in the front row, asked Sheryl Lee to autograph.

Jamaican-American Actress Sheryl Lee Ralph and Grenadian Olympian Kirani James are EVERYBODY'S, the Caribbean-American magazine, Persons of the Year for 2023. In recent years, they have been steadily receiving a sizable number of votes from our readers. In 2023, Ralph and James garnered the most nominations. We thank all who nominated someone.

Actress Sheryl Lee Ralph, singer, producer, activist and "Jamaican to the bone," is one of the most respected and admired women in the United States. When Miss Ralph sang "Lift Every Voice and Sing" during the opening ceremonies at the 2023 Super Bowl, millions of Americans, including young Black people, thought it was a new song. They were oblivious that for almost a century within African America "Lift Every Voice and Sing" was referred to as "The Negro National Anthem" or "Black National Anthem." The song, written in 1900 by James Weldon Johnson, was rendered up to the 1960s to open meetings of Black organizations.

Until she came of age, Sheryl Lee may have sung "Lift Every Voice and Sing" with her dad, Stanley Ralph, or heard him rendering it at events in Uniondale, Long Island, NY, in churches and at West Indian organizations meetings in Harlem.

Belting out "Lift Every Voice and Sing" at the Super Bowl on February 12 was one of several achievements for Ralph in 2023. A few weeks before, on January 15, she won Best Supporting Actress in a Comedy Series for her role as Barbara Howard in ABC's "Abbott Elementary" at the 2023 Critics Choice Awards

ceremonies. Five weeks after the Super Bowl, the Billie Holiday Theatre in Bedford Stuyvesant, Brooklyn, welcomed Sheryl Lee and her husband Senator Vincent Hughes. Miss Ralph was on tour promoting her new book, *DIVA: 2.0*. Fans turned out in record numbers at the Theatre for both signing sessions.

Reviews of *DIVA 2.0* are in EVERYBODY'S April edition, other print publications and in the electronic media.

Our readers and the Caribbean-American population have been observing Sheryl Lee's success for decades. They nominated her for her body of work and not simply for winning an Emmy in September 2022 for Best Supporting Actress in a Comedy Series or the Jamaican Government bestowing upon her one of the nation's National Honours. Readers are aware of Ralph's indelible mark on the entertainment industry both on stage in the Broadway musical, *Dream Girls*, and in Hollywood movies with celebrated actors such as Eddie Murphy, Denzel Washington, and the late Sidney Poitier.

Everyone is mindful that Sheryl Lee Ralph exemplifies decorum. Many young women and men are embracing the values of the woman who was born in Connecticut, raised and attended high school in Uniondale, NY, and Jamaican at heart.

"I remember Sheryl Lee very well," says Desmond Patterson, owner of Brucee's Patties in Brooklyn. "Every year, when this little girl from America came to spend time with her grandparents in Mandeville, she was not afraid to climb trees with me and other little boys. We have not met since our childhood days but I'm sure she remembers those days. She is a real Jamaican."

For Kirani James of Grenada, 2023 was not his most successful year. Track and field historians will say that in 2012, James won a Gold Medal at that year's Olympic Games. But 2023 may have been his most significant year. After winning Gold in 2012, Silver in 2016 and Bronze in 2020 (21), and when considering his years in regional competitions long before his Olympic debut, it was unbelievable that James competed in global premier track and field events in 2023 and won the 400m dash in September at the Diamond League held in Xiamen, China.

Grenada – consisting of three islands, Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique – is a nation of approximately 100,000 persons. Yet, in proportion to its size and population, it boasts that it received three Olympic medals courtesy of Kirani James. His victories have inspired young Grenadians, and they are creating their legacy in global sports. For example, the world of sports expects Grenadian Anderson Peters to win a medal in the 2024 Olympic Games scheduled in Paris, France. James plans to compete in Paris, his 4th Olympian presence, now in his thirties; he hopes to give his Spice Island and the people of Gouyave, his hometown, another Olympic medal.

EVERYBODY'S readers may have suggested James for Person of the Year not solely for his success in sports but also for his ability to overcome personal agonies. Due to health issues, he couldn't compete for months; he lost his mother, and if that was not enough, his mentor and coach, Harvey Glance, died suddenly in 2023. In each instance, James rose from the ashes.

Our readers are mindful of Kirani's impact in the Anglophone Caribbean. Jamaica's athletes have magically brought fame and glory to their country and the region; Usain Bolt, Yohan Blake, Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce, Merlene Ottey and others are household names around the world. James, too, has become a household name amongst track and field fans. His behavior on and off the tracks, mannerisms and greatness in his sport have made him a role model for Caribbean youth.

When James was informed that he is the Person of the Year for 2023, he replied, "I'll be honest, I'm really surprised. It's an honor. Other people deserve it too; therefore, I represent them."

EVERYBODY'S commenced its Person of the Year Award in 1978 upon the suggestion of Helen B. Lucas to celebrate the magazine's first anniversary. That year, Janelle Commissiong of Trinidad & Tobago who in 1977 became the first woman of color to be crowned Miss Universe received the accolades. She shared the honor with Calypso Rose, the first woman to shatter the male domination of Calypso by winning the 1977 National Calypso King title, thereby forcing the renaming of the prestigious competition to the National Calypso Monarch. Sir Arthur Lewis and his wife attended the magazine's 1980 dinner in his honor, celebrating his 1979 Nobel Prize. Sir Lewis, a Saint Lucian, was the first Black person to win the Nobel prize for economics. Recent EVERYBODY'S Person of the Year include Barbados Prime Minister Mia Mottley, New York City Mayor Eric Adams and Grenada's Prime Minister Dickon Mitchell.

50 YEARS OF HIP-HOP What A Celebration!

Hip Hop, also known as Rap, was created on August 11, 1973 by DJ Kool Herc (Clive Campbell) and his friend Coke La Rock at a back-to-school party in the Bronx, a borough of New York City. On August 11, 2023, New York City celebrated Rap's Golden Anniversary; Bronx was the epicenter of events. Many people who were not born in 1973 held street concerts across the Bronx and the official Hip-Hop Live Concert staged in Yankee Stadium. Fans filled the Stadium to enjoy performances by star-studded rap artists such as Run D.M.C., Nas, Lil' Kim, Doug E Fresh, and Snoop Dogg. On the lawn of Gracie Mansion, home of New York City's mayors, Mayor Eric Adams held a lavish reception honoring the pioneers. The 50th anniversary celebrations of hip-hop climaxed on December 10 when the Recording Academy (Grammys) and CBS presented a live concert, "A GRAMMY Salute To 50 Years Of Hip-Hop," featuring performances by Common, LL COOL J, Queen Latifah, Questlove, De La Soul, Remy Ma, and other superstars. There was an unsettling missing element: Where were the Jamaican dance-hall artists who were the progenitors of Hip-Hop?

WORLD STEELPAN DAY AUGUST 11

On July 24, 2023, the 77th Session of the United Nations General Assembly accepted a resolution by Trinidad and Tobago proclaiming every August 11th as World Steelpan Day. On August 11, fans in London, Liverpool, Tokyo, Toronto, St. Vincent, Antigua/Barbuda, Trinidad & Tobago, New York, and in many other places celebrated the first-ever World Steelpan Day. Some Caribbean Journalists claimed that it was the first time steelpan music played in Times Square. For decades, steel orchestras in N.Y. and from Trinidad and Tobago have performed in Times Square parades, festivals, and concerts. The last renowned Steel orchestra to play in Times Square may have been in 2000 when EVERYBODY'S Magazine brought the famous Invaders 48-member orchestra from Trinidad to perform in Boston, Hartford, Mount Vernon, Bronx, and Town Hall located in Times Square theater district.

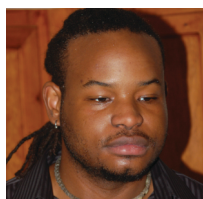

DENYSE PLUMMER "Woman Is Boss"

On August 27, Denyse Plummer (1953-2023), a calypso and gospel singer, died from cancer. Although she sang pop music in clubs in Trinidad & Tobago, calypso fans realized she was an artist to reckon with when she competed in the 1986 Calypso Fiesta at Skinner Park, San Fernando. She went on to receive accolades and, in 2001, won the National Calypso Monarch. Plummer was a fixture in Madison Square Garden's annual Mother's Day Concert. On the night of Friday, August 31, 2012, Trinidad & Tobago's 50th Anniversary of Independence, EVERYBODY'S Magazine proudly announced that during the day in Trinidad & Tobago, Plummer had been listed to receive one of the nation's highest National Medals. Plummer, the late Shadow, Singing Sandra, and living legends such as Sugar Aloes were in N.Y. performing at EVERYBODY'S Magazine Salute to Trinidad & Tobago held at Brooklyn's Tropical Paradise. Another memorable moment with Plummer and this magazine was the EVERYBODY'S World Soca Monarch held at Roseland Ballroom near Times Square when Plummer, six months pregnant, competed and placed fourth. Fans remember Plummer for the powerful message in her hit, "Woman Is Boss."

CALDERA CARABALLO Steelpan Pioneer

Reynold Juan Caraballo, known as Caldera, played the steelpan in the 1940s when the instrument and music were in their infancy. Born June 9, 1929, he was associated with the defunct Casablanca Orchestra and the indomitable Invaders. He toured with Harry Belafonte, and Caldera later brought steelpan orchestras from Trinidad & Tobago to perform at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Brooklyn Academy of Music, and other venues. In January 1957, Caldera and his band performed at the White House during the second inauguration of President Dwight Eisenhower. When President John F. Kennedy launched the Peace Corps, dispatching young Americans to assist developing countries, Caldera and his band played at the ceremony sending off America's first Peace Corps.



LENNOX & JOAN ROBINSON LOSS

Like Kwame Brathwaite, not many people have observed this magazine's masthead, "Lennox Robinson: Layout and Design Artist." He has been with this magazine for more than three decades. Therefore, when the Robinsons lost their only son in his prime of natural causes -- someone we knew as a teenager and college student years before -- the staff at EVERYBODY'S was crushed.

HARRY BELAFONTE

March 1, 1927-April 27, 2023

The news of Belafonte's death was unsurprising since he had been ailing for several years. He promoted calypso worldwide by making its witty lyrics palatable to audiences of all ethnicities. Born in Harlem and raised in Jamaica, Belafonte considered himself a folk singer, not a calypsonian. He was one of the first Black actors to play significant roles in Hollywood movies, and he became an EGOT--holder of Emmy, Grammy, Oscar, and Tony awards. Belafonte was active in the civil rights movement and a close friend of Dr. Martin Luther King.

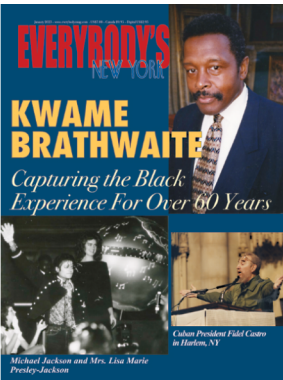

KWAME BRATHWAITE EVERYBODY'S Photojournalist

Born in Brooklyn, NY, on January 1, 1938, and grew up in Bronx, son of Barbadian parentage, Gilbert Ronald Brathwaite, changed his first name to Kwame in honor of Kwame Nkrumah, who in 1957 led Ghana into independence. Kwame's Brother, also a Pan-African activist, changed his last name to Brath. In August 2022, when the New York Historical Society staged a 6-month exhibition of Brathwaite's work, he was hospitalized and did not regain consciousness. He was unaware that every major newspaper, TV channel, and cable network publicized his work. NPR News Hour, CBS, NBC, CNN, Essence, The New York Times, and other significant tabloids mentioned his passing on April 1. He helped popularize the "Black is Beautiful" movement, and his photographs of Black women are in art galleries. Many of this magazine's dedicated subscribers did not realize that Kwame was an EVERYBODY'S Magazine photographer for more than 30 years, and he was instrumental in the survival of EVERYBODY'S.



VAUGHAN TONEY

June 29, 1955 – September 4, 2023

On September 16, approximately 2,000 friends of Vaughan Toney, including St. Vincent and the Grenadines Prime Minister Ralph Gonsalves, congregated at a very large Anglican Church in Brooklyn to say goodbye to him. Toney, the President and CEO of the Friends of Crown Heights Educational Centers (FOCH), served on many nonprofit boards including Kings County Hospital Center. He expanded FOCH into 21 full-service Early Childhood Education Centers in Brooklyn, Manhattan, and Staten Island and he advocated Center-based Infant/Toddler, 3K, and Pre-K programs. He previously served as legislative assistant to several elected officials in the New State Legislature and New York City Council. Born in St. Vincent, his final resting place, Toney was a true Caribbean man who supported everything Caribbean.

U.S. PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION BIDEN AND TRUMP
